

Tagum City FESTIVALS & EVENTS



Musikahan Festival

(February 21-27) a celebration of Filipino excellence in music composition, performance and production to provide the youth with more opportunities to excel in the music industry.



Pakaradjan Festival

(Last week of October) a special gathering of dominant Muslim Tribes in Tagum City such as K'gans (original settlers), Maranaos, Maguindanaos, Iranons and Tausogs and showcasing their cultural talents in food, music and dances.



Earthfest Summer Workshop

(April) Kids and teens enjoy a fruitful summer as they immerse themselves in different art workshops. Interwoven to these workshops is the global call to take a stand for Mother Earth. Arts serve as a medium for the advocacy for the care, preservation and rehabilitation of the environment.



Fiesta Celebration

(3rd Sunday of November) a cultural and traditional feast celebration in honor of Christ the King, the patron of the Tagumeño devotees.



Summer Sports Festival

(2nd week of May) celebration of sportsmanship and camaraderie through simultaneous tournaments of different sports events.



Kalinawa Art Exhibit

(November) The Kalinawa Art Foundation facilitates Visual Fine Art Shows and Auctions from the communities of artists. These shows are Celebrations of the Art and provide opportunities for Indigenous People and aspiring artists to earn a better living with their talents.



Flores de Tagumeño Festival

(May 1 to 30) a cultural celebration that revives the Roman Catholic traditions of fiestas introduced during the Spanish era.



Holiday Tree Lighting

(3rd week of November) an inspiration for Tagumeños to come together and witness the symbolic lighting of the gigantic Holiday Tree which symbolizes solidarity, peace and prosperity.



Binuhat Festival

(3rd week of July) an advocacy celebration recognizing the rights and social contribution of the gay community in different fields of endeavors from technical aspects, business, academe, creative and performing arts.



Food Festival

(2nd week of November) feast on an extravaganza of food offered by the different restaurants, hotels and catering companies as they showcase their crafts and expertise in food and hospitality management.



Durian Festival

(August / September) a month long celebration showcasing the delectable fresh durian produced by the Plant Now Pay Later (PNPL) beneficiaries and other durian growers in the city. The Festival highlights also include durian inter-school & professional culinary competitions that features durian as the main component. From cakes, pastries and bread, to coffee, cocktails and mocktails.



Indayog Festival

(December) a celebration of dance arts in performances, competitions and education showcasing both contemporary and traditional dances in which local and national dance artists, choreographers, writers and directors gather.



Kaimonan Festival

(October 10) cultural event of indigenous people where different tribal songs, dances, crafts, music rituals are performed for the Glory of God (Magbabaya) as a way of thanksgiving and merrymaking of God's generosity.



Fireworks Display

(31st midnight of December) a spectacular 15-minute fireworks display right at the heart of the city as Tagumeños and neighbouring constituents watch in awe!
